- Vasa Archives preserves the history of our lodges and our members. It serves as a resource to members for genealogical and immigrant research of Scandinavian ancestors.
- Nordstjernan The Vasa Star is the official publication of the Order, published 4 times per year, and mailed to every family in the Order. It carries information from the Grand Lodge, articles about our Swedish heritage, language lessons, and Lodge activities from around the US, Canada, and Sweden.
- Old Age and Benefit Fund financial assistance to members in need, based on age and years in the Order. Check out the website for the eligibility matrix and application or see an officer.
- PA District #9 Education Fund provides scholarships for the annual youth Swedish language camp, *Sjölunden*, and biennial grants for Elderhostel studies. The Grand Lodge provides scholarships for students in higher education.

Thank you for your generosity toward Holy Trinity Lutheran Church's new outreach ministry of providing laundry and shower facilities for those in need of clean clothes and bodies! You donated 34 small and 2 large bottles of shampoo, 27 small and 7 large bottles of body wash, 16 small empty refillable bottles and several extras of toothpaste and toothbrushes, hand lotion and baby powder. Thrivent Financial gave us a grant with which we were able to purchase 8 bath and 8 hand towels, 12 wash cloths, 6 laundry baskets, 4 laundry bags, 112 laundry detergent pods, 210 dryer sheets, and 200 small empty refillable bottles.
